On this day Peter W. Carter Esquire Registrar of the Vice
 Admiralty Court Newfoundland - in my presence and
 hearing acknowledged the above to be his own proper Hand

 thousand four hundred and fifty pounds thirteen Shillings and seven
 pence Sterling from Christopher J. Brown Esquire as above stated.
